ABSTRACT

During the period July 1963 to July 1971 ectoparasites were collected from the birds of eastern Asia; Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Philippines, Thailand, Borneo, Indonesia, Singapore and India. From the more than 15000 collections there were 238 genera and 564 species of arthropods represented. The number of avian hosts examined included 743 species. Of the parasite species Acarina made up 34.3%, Mallophaga 53% and Hippoboscidae 9.5%. Annotated lists of the host-parasite and the parasite-host relationships are given.

INTRODUCTION

The Migratory Animals Pathological Survey was initiated in July 1963 with the following objectives: 1. To determine the origins and movements of migratory bird populations in Eastern Asia. 2. To make a study of avian ectoparasites to serve as background information for epidemiological studies in Asian laboratories of the zoonoses 3. To make a survey of the haematozoa in birds. 4. To accrue general information concerning the ecology of Asian birds.

Grants for this work were made available to Asian biologists and equipment and technical assistance given to them.

Eventually twelve teams totalling more than 60 people were in the field capturing and ringing birds, collecting ectoparasites, collecting blood films, and making other observations concerning the bionomics of birds. These teams were under the guidance of the following scientists:

In addition short periods of study were made in Okinawa, Guam, Vietnam, Singapore, and Nepal.

Data, ectoparasites and blood films were sent to the MAPS laboratory in Tokyo and later to Bangkok where the headquarters was established at the Applied Scientific Research Corporation of Thailand in 1966.

4. Other groups have been sent to taxonomists and museums throughout the world.

The role of the authors has been that of sorting, accumulating and sifting the data and specimens as they arrived. Taxonomic papers have been published on these collections by each taxonomist and these are listed at the end of this report.

METHODS IN THE FIELD

The field teams were provided with the finely powdered commercial silicon-dioxide insecticide "Dri-die 67", procaine tubes (discarded from dental clinics) and a solution of 70% ethyl alcohol and 1% glycerine. In order to collect the arthropods the bird was dusted thoroughly with the insecticide and held quietly in the hand for five minutes. Then it was supported above a piece of white paper, out of the wind, and its feathers shaken and ruffled. The action of the "Dri-die" is to break the oil film of the arthropod's integument permitting a rapid loss of water. Most species of ectoparasites so irritated will fall from the feathers by this method. The parasites were collected from the paper, placed in a procaine tube of alcohol and glycerine, labeled, and shipped to the MAPS headquarters.

It was requested that the field teams collect ectoparasites from five individuals of each species in each habitat during each season.

Birds were captured by means of mist nets and parasites were collected from a few that were shot for museums. Although experiments were made with other types of nets the ones proving most useful were nylon or silk obtained from a Tokyo manufacturer in the following sizes: 24 mm. mesh with four panels 2.4 meters high, 12 meters long, for small birds; 36 mm. mesh, same height and length, for medium sized birds (this was the best all purpose net); 61 mm mesh, same height, and length for larger birds and shore birds. Use of the nets has been summarized by McClure (1966), Bub (1967) and numerous authors in "Bird Banding" and other journals. They are highly adaptable nets and their successful use depends upon the ingenuity of the user.

Captured birds were removed from the nets, placed in separate cloth bags and carried from the net lines to the point of ringing and ectoparasite collection. After each use the bags were reversed and shaken to reduce the chance of contamination of parasites between species.

The field teams were also provided with thirteen sizes of bird rings or bands stamped with a serial number and "Write P.O. Box 3443, Hong Kong, B.C.C."

THE AVIFAUNA OF ASIA

Because of the great interchange and exchange of populations in Eurasia the continent can not be faunistically divided into Asia and Europe. The vast deserts and mountain bulwarks of central Asia have been effective barriers to some species so that many are limited to the lands west of the Ural Mountains with migrants that move to and from Africa. East of the Urals other populations move into and out of India or South-East Asia. Ringing results (to be published) show that many species with widely dispersed Palearctic populations are made up of populations utilizing different geographical areas for over-wintering. More than 2200 species of birds are known from this vast area east of the Ural Mountains and the Indus River.

The zoogeographical designations of Palearctic, Oriental, Australasia and Tropical have been applied to these populations, with as many subdivisions as there have been zoo-geographers to discuss them. More detailed studies have made it increasingly difficult to categorize these populations by geographical distribution. At the beginning of this study it was not clear which Asian species were migratory and which were not, nor

had there been a clear definition of a migratory species. The overt migration of many forms breeding in the Palearctic and wintering in the Tropical Oriental regions were known but recent work has shown much movement within the Palearctic, within the Oriental or Tropical, and within what were considered stable or non-migratory populations.

With no historical background to refer to it is not possible to suggest how many of these modern movements of birds are related to deep seated genetic patterns and how many have been brought about by the rapid destruction and alteration of Asian habitats which has gone on during the past century. Records of new birds found recently in the various political or geographical areas of Asia have little meaning other than that the species is now present. Individuals displaced by habitat destruction may wander long distances and whether such birds can establish in new areas remains to be seen.

The most abundant terrestrial forms in species and numbers have different geographical and geological origins. Fisher and Peterson (1964) list the origins of the avian families and Table 1 refers this to some of the families that are abundant in Eastern Asia and from which we have ectoparasite material.

In every biotic community the avian complex is a mixture of families and genera utilizing the various niches present. In tropical forests the niches are numerous with a resulting ramification in the number of species present. The species complex in man-disturbed temperate areas may be reduced to a few groups with numerous individuals utilizing the few niches available. In the tropical forests, the reverse is true with few individuals and many species using the many niches. For example: In the rice and upland farming area that surround the Sagiyma Heron Sanctuary just north of Tokyo a two year's survey (McClure, unpublished) on 40 acres of rice land interspersed among tree planted farmyards indicated that there were 64 species present representing 28 families. The average number of birds per species per observation was two. In the Gombak Forest thirteen miles east of Kuala Lampur, Malaysia, a year's survey (McClure, unpublished) tallied 164 species of 37 families and one bird per species per observation. Twenty-two of the families were represented in both habitats, that completely man dominated in Japan and that only slightly disturbed in Malaya, but only eight species were found in both habitats, all migrants in Malaya and summer residents in Japan.

PARASITE POPULATIONS

At the beginning of the study it was felt that differences in the density of parasites and parasite infestations should be related to geography rather than only to host i.e. a host species would have a higher infestation at one latitude or in one habitat than another because of the ecological pressures on the parasite other than those evident within the niches on the host itself. Host distribution would obviously affect these densities where certain heavily infested species had limited geographical distribution. This would be evident where two hosts harbored the same parasite species but which had different geographical distribution and different rates of infection. Field observations indicated that certain species of birds habitually were more heavily parasitized than others. But often these species had limited geographical distribution. Mohr and Stumpf (1964) suggested that the density of parasitism may be related to host size rather than geographical distribution or host population density.

Using the political areas to indicate latitude the density of parasitism in the three major groups of parasites, biting lice or Mallophaga, feather mites and chiggers, is compared in Table 2. From Korea to Indonesia to India a total of 3001 collections of Mallophaga were made from 497 species of birds with an average collection of 5.3 parasites per bird. Eight of the twelve areas fell within 10% of this figure. Although the Thailand average appeared to be higher and that of Taiwan lower than this with a large number of collections from each the χ^2 test indicates that they fall within the range of probable variance. The temptation here is to believe that this can be interpreted to mean that basic infestation rates of Mallophaga among all species in all latitudes is similar and that latitude does not critically effect the development of parasite populations in this group. It must be remembered that the overlap in species between one country and another may be very low (12% as between Japan and Malaya). This would effect the overall density of parasites especially if host species consistently heavily infested failed to extend into higher or lower latitudes.

Among the 4893 collections of feather mites from 589 bird species the average collection included 29.5 parasites. There was considerably more geographical variation within this group than indicated by the Mallophaga for only a third of the areas fell within 20% of this average. Japan and Korea were above average, Taiwan and Hong Kong below, Philippines and Thailand about average, Malay and Indonesia considerably above average, while India fell within the average range. This suggests that the feather mites are more abundant among species in the humid tropics. The χ^2 test indicates that the tropical areas had significantly higher numbers of parasites.

Intensive studies of the leptotrombiculid mites in Thailand and Malaya distort the picture of chigger infestations. An earlier study in Malaya, McClure (in Press) indicated chigger infestations on 65 species of forest birds as compared with 78 species listed here for Thailand. In Malaya the average number of chiggers per bird was five or less while in Thailand the numbers collected were more than double this. It is suspected that even with a more intensive search in the temperate areas the relative numbers of infested species and density of chiggers would have been lower than that of the tropical areas.

Using the same format as Table 2, the relationships between parasite populations are compared in Tables 3 and 4 for families of birds grouped according to their migratory or non-migratory habits. In these tables the number of Mallophaga collected appears to be related to bird size (except for ardeids, herons) rather than migratory activities. In Table 3 among the migratory families, Hirundinidae, Turdidae, Sylviidae and Fringillidae had significantly higher populations of feather mites. Among the nonmigratory more tropical families, Rallidae, Alcedinidae, Eurylaimidae, Sturnidae, and Ploceidae had significantly higher infestations of feather mites.

Aside from the academic interest concerning what groups of parasites develop the largest populations on the birds and what birds harbor these populations the density of parasites has epidemiological implications. Certain environments may be conducive to large infestations and birds in these environments may be subject to these infestations. If such parasites are disease vectors then the dispersal of these vectors by the birds could be greater than from an environment conducive to low infestations. There is nothing in the following lists of parasites and hosts to indicate whether a parasite is a scientific oddity or a universal inhabitant of a given host species. Field collections by the various teams were not sufficiently comparable that these data could be listed by parasite or host species but in Tables 5 and 6 they are summarized by family of birds, showing some of the differences seen in the several geographical areas for the three major parasite groups.

EPIDEMIOLOGY AND AVIAN PARASITES

Two large groups of arthropod-borne agents infectious to man in Asia have been shown to be involved with avian parasites, the arbor viruses and rickettsiae producing encephalitis and typhus respectively. The arbor virus most widely studied in Asia has been Japanese Encephalitis and the typhus commonly involved with birds, Scrub Typhus. Birds of several species have been shown to act as reservoirs for Japanese encephalitis and to proliferate the disease. Birds have not been reported as common reservoirs of the typhus rickettsia, but do transport the chigger vectors.

Epidemiologically these are two vastly different relationships. The period of viremia in the bird is short, usually a matter of hours (to a few days), and the production of protective antibodies is rapid. That a migratory bird could or would migrate while viremic has been demonstrated by studies in Egypt (Watson et. al. 1972) and that it could seed the vector mosquitoes over a wide area has been developed in theory but not demonstrated in nature. The effect of viremia on "Zugenruh" in captive birds has not yet been reported.

The presence of JE antibody has been demonstrated in birds, both domestic and wild, in Japan, Taiwan, Philippines and Thailand. Infectious mosquito vectors of this virus have been reported from Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Philippines, Thailand and Malaya. In Malaya vector mosquitoes (i.e. *Culex tritaeniorhynchus*, and others) breed all year and harbor the virus during all months. In Okinawa and Japan the appearance of the vector mosquito (also *C. tritaeniorhynchus*) in the environment is related to isothermal distribution and their infectiousness is seasonal. The appearance of JE virus in temperate climates is related to the infection in the mosquitoes and to that in other vertebrate hosts. Arrival and departure dates of migrant birds have been reported for Korea, Japan, Malaya and other areas. Results from the MAPS ringing has shown that migrants may move at the rate of several hundred miles a day, and the sources of birds, arriving in the north or south are also being determined. The next step, which was beyond the scope of this program, is to develop a study which will correlate all of these relationships and which will demonstrate whether bird movements do or do not seed the virus at various latitudes.

Both from studies in Malaya and Thailand it is known that a large number of bird species are attacked by Scrub Typhus vectors and that because of this they can be moved long distances when migrants leave indigenous areas of infestation.

Studies in Malaya have shown the persistence of the viable rickettsia in chiggers over many generations. The wide range of avian hosts reported here for the vector mites (*Leptotrombidium deliensis*, *L. akamushi*, *L. scutellare*) indicate that birds can reseed sterile areas with infectious or infectable vectors each year thereby creating a continuous epidemiological problem. The public health administrator must now be aware that the elimination of Scrub Typhus infection from any given area where the vectors can survive will only be of short duration, for migrant birds or those from nearby infected areas can reinstate infected vectors.

These relationships are complex and involve the geographical distribution of the avian host, its dispersal or migratory movements, the ability of the vector to survive off of the host at various latitudes and in the environments available, and the life cycles of both the hosts and the vectors. Ectoparasites have been collected from several species of thrushes, some migratory, some sedentary, and most of them widely distributed. The simple record of parasite collections from these hosts, shown in Table 7, illustrates the complexity of these geographical and host relationships.

THE ECTOPARASITE COLLECTIONS

The approximate number of collections that were sorted and shipped each year to cooperating taxonomists was: 1964—1000, 1965—6250, 1966—1850, 1967—2025, 1968—1500, 1969—1000, 1970—500, 1971—850, totaling nearly 15,000. The following lists summarize the identification data that have been accumulated from these by September 1971. These include the collection of 238 genera of arthropods from 746 species of birds representing 70 families. The arthropods were distributed among 52 families.

Of these 238 arthropod genera 74 or 31% still do not have their respective species identified and in many cases new species remain to be described. Among the 564 identified species Acarina included 34.3%, Mallophaga 53% and the hippoboscid flies, Hippoboscidae 9.5%.

Although many species of parasites were very restricted in their host preferences some of the genera were widely distributed among the host families, i.e. **Leptotrombidium** mites were found on 131 species or 17.9% of those that were examined. Table 8 lists sixteen genera which were very widespread in their host distribution, being found on from 5 to 30% of the host species examined.

There was a greater diversity of ectoparasites, among the non-passerines than among the passerines. Non-passere families which are considered to be of earlier geological origin have more specific parasites, and evolutionary affinities are demonstrated by the similarities of the parasites. Among the passerines many families share parasite genera as well as species. These affinities were especially evident among the Mallophaga while less obligate parasites were not so restricted in host selections.

THE PARASITES AND THEIR HOSTS

Following is an annotated list of the parasites and their hosts. The parasite names are those reported by the cooperating taxonomists. The birds are listed by family and the scientific names used are from current literature as compiled for the MAPS checklist. The arthropod families are arranged in the order suggested by Baker and Wharton (1964). The country listed with each species indicates where the parasites were collected.

ACARINA

Acarina made up the greatest number of parasites, both numerically and by species. There were 28 families and 126 genera. Of these, 62 genera were represented by 194 species. When the remaining 64 genera have been studied the number of species should go well above that of the Mallophaga.

MALLOPHAGA

Mallophaga are present on most birds and the relationships with and to these hosts have been of value in evolutionary studies of both forms. Dr. K.C. Emerson who has reviewed the present collections has prepared the following notes about the order.

Mallophaga are parasitic on all species of birds and on some species of mammals, but not man. The life cycle, from egg through three nymphal stages to adult, is spent on the host. The ecological environments upon the host, which are relatively stable, determine the distribution of each species of parasite. The number of species of Mallophaga found on a bird will vary from two to more than ten, while the majority have five. The ecological niches occupied by the genera are: (1) the head and neck regions, where the lice tend to be short and fat-bodied and cling to the feathers with heavy mandibles, and where they are safe from the bird's beak (2) the wing and back regions, where the lice tend to be long and slender with long legs to facilitate rapid movement across or through the feathers to avoid the bird's beak; and (3) rapid running forms found on the body, head, neck or wings which seldom attach firmly to feathers. Each ecological niche may be occupied by more than one species or genus. Two other ecological niches are also known, but they are so specialized that their occurrence is not widely distributed: inside the pouch of the Pelecaniform birds; and inside the large quills of birds in the orders Procellariiformes, Galliformes, Psittaciformes, and Charadriiformes.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL RELATIONSHIPS

The species (Ischnocera) which are usually firmly attached to the feathers in ecological niches (1) and (2) feed entirely on feathers. It is doubtful that these species are involved in the transmission of disease between hosts. Populations of lice, when abnormally high, will denude some of the feather shafts, and cause intense irritation by movement. Young and sick birds usually are more heavily infested than healthy adults.

Those Mallophaga (Amblycera) which are body lice, feed on blood, mucus, and serum. Some are equipped with piercing mouthparts, and others obtain blood from wounds created by their mandibles. Very little work has been done on the transmission of disease by these species but to date the following have been reported; (1) Intermediate host for a filarial worm in Swifts, cestode in dogs and a filarial worm in dogs. (2) Virus of Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis has been isolated in a species of Mallophaga common on galliform birds. (3) Bedsonia organisms have been isolated in a species also on galliform birds.

The role or importance of Mallophaga in the transmission of diseases between hosts remains to be explored. There has been little interest in this area, because they do not feed on man and are considered to be of little medical importance. So few people can properly identify Mallophaga that lice pooled for virus isolation usually are composed of those species which do not feed on blood. As interest in wildlife diseases increases, and more work is done on their epizootiology, a better understanding of the role of Mallophaga in disease transmission will probably result.

MALLOPHAGA AND AVIAN EVOLUTION

Our present knowledge of the systematics of Mallophaga has reached the stage where it is very useful in assisting with the development of a better understanding of the relationship of species or groups of species of birds. As birds evolved from a common stock, the Mallophaga also evolved, but at a slower pace. This occurred because the environmental change imposed upon the parasite was less than that imposed on the host. The food supply for the parasite (composition of the feathers, blood, serum etc.) and the temperature and humidity of its environment probably remained more nearly stable than did the environmental changes which influenced change in the hosts. The picture is somewhat complicated by the fact that today we sometimes find both primary and secondary infestations of Mallophaga on a host species. This parasitism arose at different times in the evolution of the host and most specialists in Mallophaga can recognize these differences and so advise the ornithologist.

Most species of Mallophaga are restricted to a single species of host. Other relationships also exist between the parasites and the higher taxonomic categories. Examples of these are as follows: (1) A number of species are restricted to a single host genus rather than a single species of host. Examples are: **Trinoton aculeatum** Piaget 1855, a large body louse found on Tree Ducks of the genus **Dendrocygna**; and **Laemobothrion tinnunculi** (Linnaeus, 1758), a large body louse found on hosts of the genus **Falco** (Gyrfalcon, Falcon, Kestrel and Sparrow Hawk). (2) Birds of more than one genus, which obviously are closely related, may share a common parasite. **Ciconophilus cygni** Price and Beer, 1965, a small body louse, is found on the Swans (Mute, Whooper, Whistling and Trumpeter). **Ciconophilus pectiniventris** (Harrison, 1916) is found on Brants and Geese of the genera **Branta**, **Philacte**, **Anser** and **Chen**. In these two examples, hosts relationships above the generic level are evidenced by the lice they harbor. (3) Many genera of lice are restricted to hosts of only one family. However, only few species are widely distributed on hosts of a family. **Ciconophilus decimfasciatus** (Boisduval and Lacordaire, 1835) is a small body louse found on Herons, Egrets, and Bitterns of the genera **Ardea**, **Bubulus**, **Dichromannassa**, **Casmerodius**, **Egretta**, **Hydranassa**, **Nycticorax**, **Nyctanassa** and **Botaurus**. **Laemobothrion glutinans** Nitzsch, 1861 is a large body louse found on the Turkey Vulture, the Black Vulture and the California Condor. **Brueelia straminea** (Denny, 1842) is a wing shaft louse found on Flickers, Sapsuckers and Woodpeckers of the genera **Colaptes**, **Centurus**, **Melanerpes**, **Asyndesmus**, **Sphyrapicus** and **Dendrocopos**. In each example given, the relationship exhibited by a grouping of hosts into a family is confirmed by the lice. (4) The number of species of Mallophaga that can be found on hosts of more than one family within an order are few. **Ancistriona vagelli** (J.C. Fabricius, 1787) is a large body louse found on hosts of the order Procellariiformes. It has been found to date on hosts of the genera **Daption**, **Fulmar**, **Puffinus**, **Pterodroma**, **Pelagodroma**, and **Oceanites**. **Ricinus marginatus** (Children, 1836) is a large body louse found on the hosts of families Cotingidae and Tyrannidae. It has been collected from hosts of the genera **Platyparis**, **Tyrannus**, **Muscivora**, **Myiarchus**, **Sayornis**, **Empidonax**, **Contopus** and **Pyrocephalus**. There are also a few species which may occur on hosts of more than one family in the Galliformes.

OTHER ECOLOGICAL RELATIONSHIPS

The influence of geography on the distribution of bird species is recognized; however, the influence of geography on the distribution of Mallophaga within the range of hosts is not well understood. The Barn Owl, *Tyto alba*, is found in many parts of the world. In North America, Australia, New Zealand and Southeast Asia it harbors *Strigiphilus aitkeni* Clay, 1966. In Europe, Africa and the Middle East it harbors *Strigiphilus rostratus* (Burmeister, 1838). We have no data on which parasite species appears in China, Japan and Siberia. The morphological differences between these two species of Mallophaga are far greater than those of the subspecies of *Tyto alba* found in these locations.

The Brown Booby, *Sula leucogaster*, and the Red footed Booby, *Sula sula*, both occur on the east and west coasts of North America. Regardless of where these hosts occur, they harbor *Eidmanniella albescens* (Piaget, 1880) and *Pectinopygus annulatus* (Piaget, 1880). In addition to these parasites, the birds found on the east coast harbor *Pectinopygus garbei* (Pessoa and Guimaraes, 1935), while those found on the west coast have *Pectinopygus sulae* (Rudow, 1869). This relationship exists even in Panama where the distance between flocks of the same species is not great. There are many other examples.

The commonest geographical relationship seen is that of a species limited in distribution to that of its host which has a restricted range.

In some way the size of the host may be a controlling factor in the type of Mallophagan infestation.

Species of the genus *Falcolipeurus* can be found on the quills of the primaries of the larger birds in the Falconiformes. Apparently members of the genus cannot survive on the smaller birds. Species of the genus have to date been recorded in North America from hosts of the Cathartidae, Accipitridae (*Rostrhamus*, *Aquila*, and *Haliaeetus*) and Falconidae (*Caracara*). Species within the genus *Falcolipeurus* are fairly host specific, but occurrence of a genus on hosts seems to be dependent upon host size since hosts of three families within the Falconiformes harbor these parasites.

Saemundssonia tringae (O. Fabricius, 1780) is a parasite found on the head and neck region of many small species of Charadriiformes. It has been recorded in North America from the host genera *Arenaria*, *Calidris*, *Erolia*, *Limnodromus* and *Ereunetes*. The list of hosts could probably be enlarged if collections were available from other small birds not listed.

Following domestication of a host its parasites may become less specific in their host relationships. The original host for *Menopon gallinae* (Linnaeus, 1758) apparently was the wild chicken. The original host for *Menacanthus stramineus* (Nitzsch, 1818) apparently was the wild turkey. Since domestication of these two hosts, both species can be found on any gallinaceous host raised in association with barnyard flocks. In some cases the two parasites may occur in limited numbers on domestic ducks and geese. Also in some regions of the world these parasites are now established in many species of wild gallinaceous hosts.

A similar situation probably exists with the parasite **Colpocephalum turbinatum** Denny, 1842. This parasite, originally found on doves and pigeons, can now be found on kites, hawks, owls and eagles, where it is now established.

There is some evidence that host color may effect host selection by a parasite. Species of **Ardeicola**, found on the primaries of hosts of the order Ciconiiformes, appear to be host specific, with one exception. Recently it has been found that **Ardeicola expallidus** Blagoveshtchensky, 1940, a parasite first found on the Little Egret, **Egretta garzetta**, is also found on the common Egret, **Casmerodius albus**; the Cattle Egret, **Bubulcus ibis**; and the Snowy Egret, **Leucophoyx thula**. The only criteria for this distribution apparently is color of the host.

OTHER ARTHROPODS FOUND ON BIRDS

Many species of arthropods other than those known to be parasitic on birds were found upon them during these collections. Many were probably accidental, but others were taken often enough to suggest that they may either ride on the birds or have some other reason for being there. These incidental or accidental specimens were as follows.

Enough collections of psocids have now accumulated from birds to suggest that they are not purely accidental in occurrence. There may be some feeding or dispersal relationship which remains to be demonstrated.

Collections made from House Swallow nestlings in Korea. A nest parasite. Ephydriidae, **Discocerina** sp. Rostratulidae: **Rostratula benghalensis**. Snipe, from Philippines. Probably accidental.
